### **Academic Responsibilities**

Student academic achievement requires the effort and cooperation of teachers, parents, and students. In order to achieve their fullest potential, students are expected to:

-  Arrive on time for class.
-  Be prepared with required materials for each class.
-  Apply their best effort to complete all work (class work and homework) to the best of their ability.
-  Demonstrate a positive attitude.

### **Homework Policy**






Sixth-Grade students are assigned homework every school night. This will include 30 minutes of nightly reading and any additional practice in other classes. Homework provides students the opportunity to practice their learning, to prepare for upcoming class lessons, and to develop responsibility. On Monday through Thursday, students will have L Block, which is a 30-minute period dedicated to starting homework and seeking extra help from core academic teachers. Whatever homework is not finished during L Block is expected to be completed at home. Students are responsible for recording their homework assignments in their Agendas/Planners during each class.

In the event that a student misses a homework assignment, a discussion between the student and the teacher will occur. **Parents will be notified if a child is missing homework on a consistent basis.**

### **Behavior Expectations**

Emerald Team students will be collaborating to create a Social Contract.

In general, students are expected to:

-  Treat others (peers and adults) with respect.
-  Be honest.
-  Avoid disrupting the learning of other students.
-  Behave in a safe manner and follow school rules.
-  Appropriately use technology as outlined in the student handbook.

If inappropriate behavior persists, parents will be contacted.

**Any physical altercations will result in an immediate office referral and possible removal from the next team-sponsored event.**
