# Teaching

- A **sentence** is a group of words that expresses a complete thought.
  - A **declarative sentence** makes a statement and ends with a period.
    - Many animals live in the sea.
  - An **interrogative sentence** asks a question. It ends with a question mark (?).
    - Do you know that dolphins breathe air?
  - An **imperative sentence** gives a command or makes a request. It ends with a period or exclamation point.
    - Go take a seat.    or    Sit down!
  - An **exclamatory sentence** expresses strong feelings and ends with an exclamation point (!).
    - Starfish see only dark and light!

# Teaching

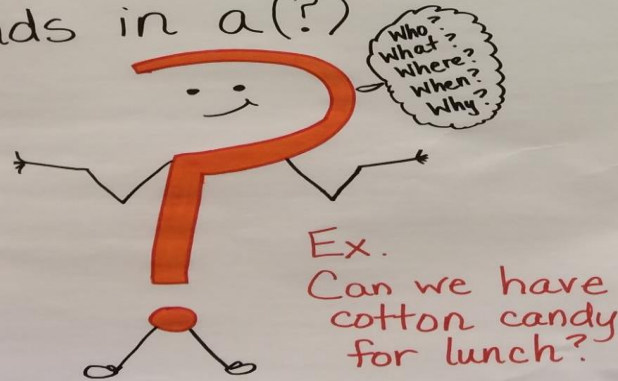
## DECLARATIVE

Tells us a statement.  
Ends in a period.



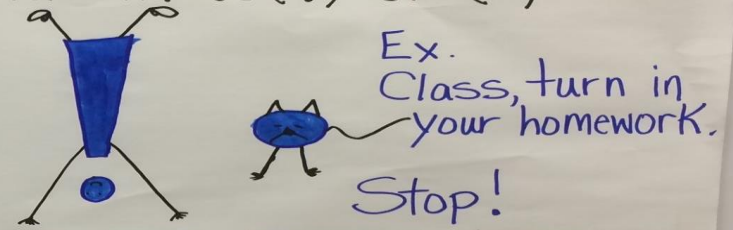
## INTERROGATIVE

Asks us a question.  
Ends in a (?)



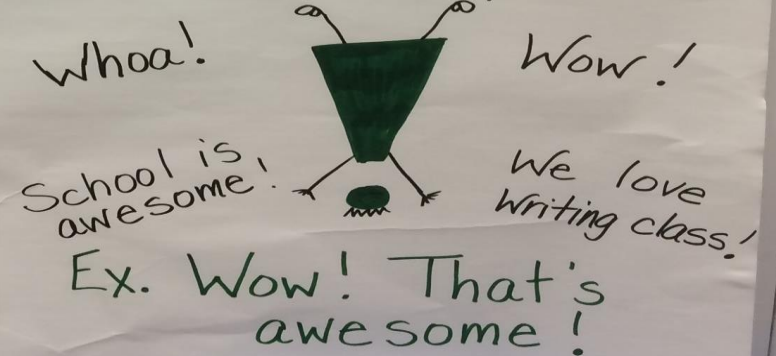
## IMPERATIVE

Tells us to do something.  
It is a command.  
Ends in a (!) or (.)



## EXCLAMATORY

Shows strong emotion.  
Ends with a (!)
