2. use a comma and coordinating conjunction (FANBOYS)
3. use a semi-colon

two complete sentences that run together.

Fix a run-on:

1. Create two sentences.
2. Create a compound sentence by using conjunctions

F = for

A = and

N = nor

B = but

O = or

y = yet

S = so
