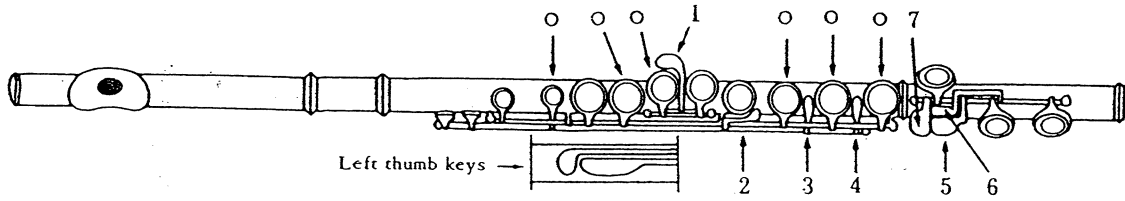


FLUTE

Fingering Chart



How to read the chart: ● Solid black circles indicate keys pressed.
 ○ Open circles indicate open tone holes.
 1-2-3-4-5-6-7 Numbers indicate additional keys to be pressed.
